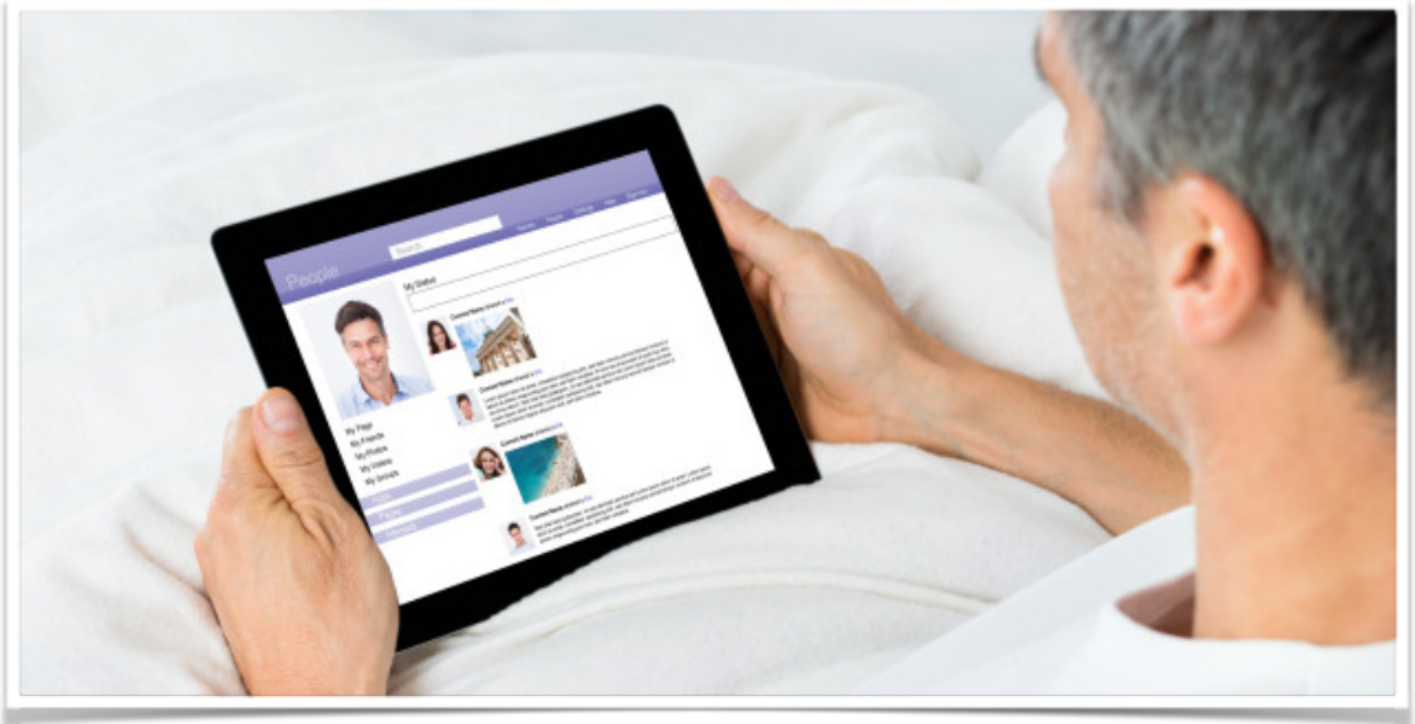


Date Ipswich Singles Dating eBook

STEP 2: Write About Yourself - It's Easier Than You Think

DO	DON'T
Be honest	Hide or bend the truth
Be you	Lie about your weight/age/background
Add your real age	Reveal personal details
Keep it brief (about 150 words)	Use cliches
Let your personality shine through	Sell sex
Be humorous	Involve the ex
Be specific about what you're looking for	Write what you're not looking for
Leave the drama behind	Forgot to spell check & use proper grammar
Be positive	Be negative

DATE THE SAFE WAY

You've probably heard a lot of stories about online dating! Keeping your wits about you, and following these top tips will set you off on the right foot without feeling apprehensive about dating in Ipswich.

- ✓ Be careful when accessing your account from a public or shared computer so that others can't view or record your password or personal information.
- ✗ Don't include your contact information such as your email address, home address, or phone number in your profile or messages
- ✓ Be wary of opening email attachments from someone you have only just met
- ✗ Don't give out your life-story the first time you chat. There will be plenty of time to share such details if your relationship develops
- ✓ If and when you do decide to share an email address think about creating a separate and anonymous email
- ✗ Don't include your surname or any other identifying information when choosing your username
- ✓ Create a username based on your interests, rather than personal details
- ✗ Stop communicating with anyone who pressures you into providing your personal or financial information
- ✓ Ensure that you keep your internet security software up to date
- ✗ Don't put up with offensive, insulting and threatening behaviour

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
